There are two likely culprits for the poor performance.

The signal from the camera to the outside world is the most likely cause, we'll address that with an external aerial, it's only 8" tall so will hopefully remain out of sight.

Another cause could be the fluctuating power supply. From time to time the Hut lights flicker and they shouldn't. This is maybe the voltage controller giving up which causes the lighting flicker. This in turn may affect the camera, we'll address both problems. In the meantime, Mehdi has the camera at home so he can give a stern talking to.

However, a new AcroWot has taken to the skies, Dan C has built a kit version and powered it with an OS 55 two stroke engine. Dan glassed the plane and sprayed it in its red and white colour scheme.
